1 With only 18 uniquely appointed rooms—plus an antique billiards table, mural-adorned music room, and library—it's easy to pretend this opulently restored Gilded Age mansion is your private abode. (Just remember not to wear the plush Frette bathrobe down to breakfast in the morning.)

2 Don't worry about taxis or rental cars. An antique London taxi will chauffeur you to the Walters Art Museum, Penn Station, or anywhere around town that strikes your fancy.

3 A single-malt drinker? The Ivy's concierge already knew that and put a bottle of Macallan in your room, next to the chocolates and house-made cookies on the hand-painted "barmoire." (You're welcome.)

4 The Magdalena, easily the best restaurant in Baltimore, is just downstairs. Order a bourbon-spiked Arnold Palmer, seared scallops, and the Berkshire pork ... and don't even think about skipping dessert.
